BOATS LEAVING TO-DAY.

The towboat J. P. Jackson, which it will be remembered, took the largest tow of coal ever sent out of Pittsburgh to New Orleans, left the latter point for the Ohio last evening.

The Coal City is aground near Cairo, and is reported to be in very bad shape, all but three of her tow being stranded. The Transit will attempt to get the steamer and tow aloft.

To-morrow morning the Hudson will be home from Cincinnati to Pittsburgh. She is due at 8 a. m., and is reported to have a good trip below. Tuesday's Cincinnati packet is the Keystone State, and no doubt Capt. Calhoun's popular boat will have her usual fine trip.

The present coal shipment out of Pittsburgh is a big one, the shipment to Cincinnati alone being over 3,000,000 bushels, in 197 barges and 16 boats. The consignments for Louisville and lower ports aggregate 6,785,000 bushels, lower ports and 53 boats. Up to last evening there had been no serious accidents to the big coal fleet.

The river is still rising at this port, and last evening the marks at the public landing showed 11 feet full. This is as high as it got here on the late tow boat rise, and already coal is beginning to pass down for the southern ports.

Yesterday the following tow boats passed here: Boat, 3 p. m.; Pacific, 3 p. m.; Enterprise, 4 p. m. The Adelle, passed with Captain George Conant at her wheel, passed up at 2 p. m.

Last night's headwater reports were as follows:
Pittsburgh—By marks below the dam, 14 feet 6 inches and rising; clear and cool.
Oil City—River has done its best here on the present rise; to-night it is 11 feet and falling; snowing and cold.
Warren—River 8 feet 9 inches and a light snow falling; very cold.
Greensboro—River 6 feet 4 inches and falling; snowing to-night.
Morgantown—River 7 feet 10 inches and still rising slowly; light snows and cold weather.
