

INTO WEST VIRGINIA.

Pennsylvania Railroad to Extend Its Lines Next Spring

TO TAP OUR BIG COAL FIELDS.

A Competing Line Up the Monongahela River Parallel With the Fairmont Branch of the Baltimore & Ohio—The Preliminary Steps Already Taken—After the Coke Trade.

When the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad Company were pushing the State Line railroad, now the Fairmont branch, through into West Virginia, there was much talk of the Pennsylvania Railroad company building a competing line. But beyond a few preliminary surveys nothing was ever done.

CALLS TO STOCKHOLDERS.

Two calls to stockholders have been sent out, one from the office of the Pittsburgh, Virginia & Charleston Railroad Company and the other from the office of the Brownsville & State Line Railroad Company.

The preliminary steps toward this movement were taken several months ago at a meeting held in Philadelphia, but it was decided not to begin active operations until the business panic was tided over.

It is also believed that the Vanderbilt system will be next to seek early West Virginia connection by extending the Pittsburgh & Lake Erie via the McKeesport & Bellevue Railroad on through Brownsville and up the river on the east side.

Some expensive roadbed improvements will soon be made on the Pittsburgh division of the Baltimore & Ohio between here and Pittsburgh. Work on them will be commenced at once and pushed to completion as rapidly as possible.

When the Baltimore & Ohio officials were on their inspection tour over this division two weeks ago they made a trip up the Mt. Pleasant branch, and from there drove over to the Morwood plant of the Southwest Connellsville Coke Company, known as Southwest No. 1.

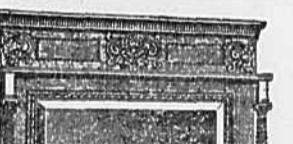
