IT WAS A TIE.

Board of County Commissioners Do Not Agree Relative to APPROPRIATIONS FOR ROADS.

Members From the Country Districts Object to the Scaling of Appropriations Reported by the Roads and Bridges Committee—The Filling Case Proposition was Knocked Out—The Annual Appropriation Ordinance.

The meeting of the Ohio county board of commissioners yesterday morning, which continued into the afternoon, was the most interesting recently held. One of the most interesting phases of the session was the knock-out blow administered to the proposition to put in filing cases and book shelves in the office of the county clerk.

Another important matter was the scaling of the annual appropriation ordinance which provides for the expenditures of the fiscal year in the various departments of the county board. The finance committee brought in a recommendation scaling the appropriations for roads and bridges, just as the other departments were scaled.

The report of the committee on court house and jail, which a week ago passed a resolution to the effect that the vault in the office of the county clerk be fitted up with new file cases and shelves, at a cost of over \$4,000, was received.

The committee on poor house and farm reported the resignation of Miss Belle Gillilan as nurse at the county hospital. This was accepted, to take place when her successor is appointed.

The board and bridge committee recommended that the contract for lumber for the use of the county for the year be let to James White, at his bid of \$18.50 per 1,000 feet for lumber sixteen feet long or less, and \$20 per 1,000 feet for lumber sixteen to twenty-two feet long.

Bids were opened for medical attendance and medicine for prisoners in jail, and the contract was awarded to Dr. C. S. Terrill, at his bid of \$72.

County Clerk Robertson petitioned for a telephone for the accommodation of attorneys and the general public and officials. It was referred to the committee on court house and jail.

A communication was received from A. C. Wagner, recorder of the town of Fulton, calling attention to some dangerous places in the national road inside the limits of the town.

W. C. Smith, justice of the peace for Triadelphia district, tendered his resignation, and it was accepted. Mr. Burke nominated J. C. Duncan, and an application was received from J. C. Marple. Mr. Duncan was elected.

Bonds were received and approved as follows: N. Nickerson, superintendent first division of the National road, \$2,000, with E. M. Atkinson as surety; W. T. Crammie, superintendent second division of the same road, \$2,000, with F. C. Hady and C. S. Terrill as sureties; John Korn, superintendent third division of same road, \$2,000, with D. Maxwell surety; John Short, constable for Centre district, \$2,000, with John Cummins and F. M. Church sureties.

Licenses were granted as follows: Elm Grove, Fred Hartell, John Gamble and Aug. Pezinger; miscellaneous, William Pette, Amelia Walter, Wheeling Park Association, John Dolan.

W. R. Hanna, elected constable for Liberty district, had failed to qualify within the specified time, and was re-appointed.

This brought the board down to the appropriation ordinance, as reported from the committee. A good deal of time was spent over it, and then it was referred to the finance committee, to cut down the road and bridge appropriations and report at the afternoon session.

The board then adjourned, and the finance committee met and put in a solid hour on the ordinance, with the result that it was reported in the following shape:
