

THAT "AIR SHIP"

CHICAGO PEOPLE VIEWED IT.

CHICAGO, April 12.—That "air ship" has been seen again—that is, in this vicinity.

To be sure, it was also seen in Kankakee, Mount Carroll and other places at the same time, but the people in those cities must have been mistaken, or else there is a whole flock of air ships cavorting about through the heavens.

The real "air ship," the one that was seen here, seems to have a fondness for Evanston, for that classic city enjoyed its second sight from an orchestra seat, while Chicago strained its eyes from the second balcony.

There is no doubt that Evanston saw something, and what else could it be but an air ship? There is also no doubt that Evanston was not excited—and inside the four mile limit. The first man who saw it gave the alarm.

The light was first seen in the heavens about 3 o'clock. It was apparently close to Evanston than to Chicago.
