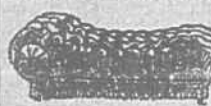

Bridgeport Council Rejects an Application from the Wheeling Railway Company Conditionally—Five-cent fare to Wheeling is Wanted.

At an adjourned meeting of the Bridgeport council last night the important question before the body was that of granting the Wheeling Railway Company the privilege of making a connection on Bridge and Bank streets with the tracks of the Martin's Ferry, Bridgeport and Bellaire line. The application was unanimously rejected, unless the railway company would grant a five-cent fare between Bridgeport and Wheeling. There is no intimation as to what will be the course of the Wheeling Railway Company, but the Bridgeporters are confident they will secure the concession.
