RAILROADS TO AID JAMESTOWN EXPO.

The railroads that traverse Virginia are evincing a deep interest in the success of the Jamestown Exposition, and have indicated their intention of aiding this movement in every possible way. The executive heads of the various lines are acquainting themselves with the situation, and for that purpose visited the exposition grounds Thursday last. Later a conference was held in Norfolk at which Governor Swanson was present, and who, in speaking of the outlook especially in Southwest Virginia, said in part:

"I feel assured that the Jamestown exposition will be a marked success. The progress in the erection of the buildings is amazing; the interest of the people is increasing each day, and I think the exposition may be considered as secured as a great success."

"I have just returned from Southwest Virginia, where I went to meet the mineral interests of that section, toward making an exhibition of Virginia's marvelous mineral resources. The people of that section responded generously, and are taking a great deal of interest in the exposition. I feel that Virginia will make one of the best mineral exhibits that any state has ever yet made."

"The twelfth of June has been selected as Virginia Day, and I purpose to have a 'home-coming week' in Virginia at that time. I feel sure that the Virginia people will actively and patriotically co-operate to make this exposition a great success."
