MAY TAKE COURTS A YEAR

BUT COMMISSION WILL PUSH THE HARRIMAN INQUIRY.

Washington, May 24.—It is not the intention of the Interstate Commerce Commission to await the result of the proceedings to be instituted against E. H. Harriman to compel him to answer certain inquiries that were put to him in the New York investigation before taking action on the general subject of the investigation.

In the opinion of members of the commission, it may be a year or even more before final decision can be reached regarding the courts of the commission to compel Mr. Harriman to answer its questions. The proceeding to that question. The product in the courts of the Southern district of New York the latter part of this month or the first of next month. They will be for the purpose of obtaining an order from the court to compel Mr. Harriman to respond to the inquiries. If the court should issue such an order Mr. Harriman may carry the case to higher courts and eventually to the United States Supreme Court. Should the lower court's decision be adverse to the commission it will probably carry the matter to the higher tribunal, as the question involves a right of the commission.

Arguments in the Standard Oil cases in St. Paul will occupy the attention of Attorneys Kellogg and Severance, of the commission, for several days, and they will not be able to take up the Harriman matter until after that time.

Without reference, however, to the determination of that question the commission will consider the merits of the general inquiry into the Harriman lines case and reach its conclusion on the facts presented. Indications are that a determination of the case will be reached in a few weeks.

stock into the market for the purpose of depressing values.

These statements are according to reports received by Pittsburg brokers today. It is stated that the officials demanded the resignation, and that Corey is attempting to retaliate by selling his stock in the company.

That A. C. Dinkey, president of the Carnegie Steel Company, has been slated for the position has been rumored for some time. The only thing in the way is the report that Judge E. H. Gary, now chairman of the board, may assume Corey's place. Inquiry here shows that if Dinkey should not be elevated to the head of the Steel Corporation when a vacancy occurs, it would likely be because of the trouble over defective steel rails which has cropped up within the last year. Many of the rails were made in the Carnegie mills, over which Mr. Dinkey has supreme control.
