

# COMPANY H. BOYS COMING IN A BODY

### Plans Under Way to Give Them a Rousing Reception.

Definite plans for a grand welcome for the fifty Fairmont boys who are in the One Hundred and Thirteenth Ammunition Train, former members of Company H, First West Virginia Regiment, were worked out at a meeting of members of Company H who have already returned, other Fairmont soldiers and sailors and friends and relatives of the boys, held at the court house yesterday evening.

A committee on arrangements was named as follows: Charles R. Barry, William R. Ice, and Waldron Leonard, all former members of Company H.

A committee consisting of Lieutenant C. J. Straight, Waldron Leonard and Industrial Secretary L. S. Thomas of the local Y. M. C. A. was appointed to proceed to Washington to meet the men there and supply them with cigarettes, candies and other articles.

Word has been received from Washington to the effect that the men from Fairmont will be discharged in a body. The exact date of their discharge will be made known later in sufficient time for the three men to proceed to Washington. The men arrived in New York on the transport Zeelandia, Tuesday.

It was the opinion of those present last evening that the men would not want a dinner at this time of the year and would not enjoy marching in a parade or being compelled to listen to speeches. They would be better pleased to see all of their friends at the station to greet them and every effort will be made to get a large crowd out.

Plans have been laid to get a band out to meet the train and to have trucks at the station to handle their baggage.

BERLIN, Tuesday, July 29.—(By Associated Press)—Dr. Karl Helfferich, the former vice chancellor, announced today that having allied to induce Matthias Erzberger to sue him he will enter suit against Erzberger to "prove him a liar and traitor and to bring the truth to light."

A Berlin dispatch under date of July 2nd reported Dr. Helfferich writing in the Kreuze Zeitung claiming the schtag peace program of July 1917, fathered by Erzberger, to have been responsible for the collapse of the German people.

# COMPLETE HEARING IN HOPE GAS CASE

Public Service Commission Will Make New Order in Short Time.

CHARLESTON, W. Va., July 31.—Evidence was completed at the hearing yesterday before the public service commission of the complaint of the city of Morgantown against the Hope Natural Gas company protesting that the company does not supply the distributing companies at Morgantown with an adequate supply of gas for local use in preference to shipping it out of the state.

Samuel S. Ayer, consulting engineer of Columbus, Ohio, who had made investigation for the Hope Natural Gas company was cross-examined at the hearing today.

The commission several months ago ordered the Hope Natural Gas company to furnish gas to the West Virginia Traction and Electric company and the Randall Gas company, distributing companies at Morgantown, which order has not been complied with, according to R. B. Bernheim, secretary of the commission.

After the time has passed for the filing of briefs by both sides to the controversy—the maximum length of which is 35 days—the commission will enter order in the case.
