## DAWE

Resigns as General Managing Director of Commercial Congress.

WASHINGTON, June 14.—G. Grosvenor Dawe has resigned as managing director of the Southern Commercial Congress. He will immediately enter upon a study of all questions of national development as affected by local, national and international commercial organizations of every kind. Mr. Dawe, however, will remain on the board as a resident director.

Dr. Clarence J. Owens, secretary-treasurer, has been elected managing director of the executive offices. The change is effective today. Resolutions were unanimously adopted by the board, highly commendatory of Mr. Dawe's long and efficient service. Dr. Owens, who came to the congress two years ago from the presidency of the state college of Alabama, and who has since served as secretary-treasurer, is well equipped for his new duties. Previous to coming to Washington he was widely known as an educator throughout the South and as commander-in-chief of the Sons of Confederate Veterans of the United States. Following Dr. Owens' election William H. Saunders was elected treasurer, and Charles A. Douglas general counsel. Mr. Saunders is president of the realty firm of William H. Saunders

and Company, and is one of the real estate directors of the congress. Mr. Douglas is a well known attorney and also a resident director. Mr. Dawe, prior to December 1908, was secretary of the Commercial Club of Montgomery, Ala., in which the Southern Commercial Congress movement started. He is one of the vice-presidents of the Southern Commercial Secretaries Association and a director of the American Association of Commercial Executives. Senator Duncan U. Fletcher, of Florida, president of the Southern Commercial Congress, made the following statement today:  
"The work of the Southern Commercial Congress is broader than ever and its efficiency stronger. Its prospects and support are greater than ever before. The organization has worked its way into the approval of the South and the country. Its service has been recognized as invaluable. It has grown steadily with the knowledge of its work, and will continue to broaden and strengthen its service."

## WOMAN JAILED

For Five Days in Default of Paying a Fine for Drunkenness.

In default of paying a fine of \$25 and costs for drunkenness, a woman giving the name of Cora McGinness was sentenced to serve five days in jail this morning in the police court by Mayor Frank R. Moore.
