A STREET FAIR

To be Given Next Summer by the Wheeling Lodge of Elks.

COUNCIL GIVES PERMISSION

For the Occupancy of Streets on the South Side—Special Railroad Rates will be Secured, and Many Thousand Visitors will be Attracted to the City—Details of the Project will now be Worked out.

Canton had a "street fair" last summer that attracted over 50,000 people to the presidential town in a week.

The committee of the lodge which has the enterprise in charge has closed a contract for the appearance here at its fair of the Exposition Circuit Company, with its "Midway" multitude of attractive features, which are alone sufficient to make the fair a great success.

The "street fair" will be held on Chapline street, beginning at Twelfth and extending down to Twenty-second; on Twenty-second, Chapline to Eoff; on Eoff, Twenty-second to Twenty-fourth.

Plans and specifications for the booths will be prepared shortly, and their bids will be asked for the construction. They will be roofed, and lighted by electricity.

It is expected that all the Wheeling merchants will take space in the booths. Already 1,200 feet of booth space has been asked for by merchants.

The lodge is arranging to give each charitable institution in the city a booth free of charge and the exclusive right for the sale of some particular article.

The Elks will ask the chamber of commerce to aid in booming the fair, which that body will doubtless be glad to do, as the project will boom the city as it hasn't been boomed or advertised for a long time.
