WELLSBURG: J. B. Walkinshaw, city health officer, and Dr. C. R. Welch, state health officer, have issued proclamation requiring all merchants to screen fruits, confections, cakes and other foodstuffs whether displayed on the outside or on the inside of their stores.

SHEPHERDSTOWN: This city is to have a new water works system, long needed, city council having granted a franchise to the Shepherdstown Light and Power Company. Work will begin this week and the plant is to be completed in ninety days at a cost of approximately \$16,000.

WHEELING: T. J. Humphreys, principal of the Washington public school in the First ward, is carrying on a campaign at teachers' institutes and at other assemblies in behalf of his theory that children below the sixth grade should never have to do any studying at night. The after school hours should be devoted to play, or sleep, he believes.
