SMALL-POX ON PADDLE CREEK. The board of health of the county held a meeting at the court house Tuesday: Present: C. M. Fraley, president of the county court; Dr. J. W. Rife, president of the board; Rufus Lester, secretary and D. B. Hardwick, pros. atty.

It had been reported to the board that a case of small-pox had developed at Sih Webb's home on Paddle creek in Butler district. The Board employed Louie Barr to wait on the case and see that a quarantine is maintained and Dr. Rife was instructed to go at once and render the necessary medical aid.
