RETIREMENT OF BILLINGS IS BLOW TO HARNESS RACING WORLD!

 The harness racing world has been staggered by the announcement that C. K. G. Billings will dispose of his great breeding farm in Virginia, practically all of his string of great trotters and pacers and retire from racing and breeding.

The retirement of Billings is certain to be a serious blow to the pastime he has been interested in for more than 25 years as an amateur reinsman, breeder and exhibitor.

His stables include the greatest trotters of a generation, including Lou Dillon, 1:58 1-2, world's fastest trotting mare and the first trotter to step a mile under two minutes; Uhlán, 1:54
