EDISON, FORGETTING TO EAT OR SLEEP WORKS ALL NIGHT ON U. S. WAR PLANS!

By J. H. DUCKWORTH NEW YORK, March 7.—Thomas A. Edison is off on another "insomnia spree."

He is working so hard nowadays in his little old shack at East Orange, thinking up things that might be useful to Uncle Sam for war purposes, that he has neither time to eat nor sleep.

These orgies of mental labor are intermittent with Edison. The present one is the worst the inventor ever has had.

A pacifist at heart, he has spent all his life fashioning things for the betterment of mankind. But now that his country is threatened, he is in a fighting mood.

Edison's friends are sure that when he climbs again on the reason-wagon he will reveal some new and revolutionary weapon of offense that will flabbergast even the inventive Teuton.

It is impossible to interview Edison these times. Because he is chairman of the United States naval consulting board, his lips have been sealed by the government.

A written request for an interview sent into his laboratory brought forth the scribbled response: "Too busy. Feeling fine and working hard."

"You can't see father these days," said Charles Edison, his son. "He is on a rampage of work, and mustn't be disturbed."

He works all day and most of the night, after his assistants have gone home to bed.

"How long will this last?" Edison regards himself simply as "one of the boys" at the big plant at East Orange.

Today he got on the job at 9:21. Last night, the time sheets showed, he quit work at 7:51. Yesterday was a "short day," it was told.

It is understood Edison is now spending most of his time on naval warfare work for Secretary Daniels. While he often visits the scattered laboratories, his really intensive thinking is done in a rather ransackable hut in the park some way from the main building.

In this cell-like seclusion, puffing steadily at an evil-smelling corn cob, and surrounded by a jumble of beakers, retorts, test tubes and lathes, Edison is confidently believed to be evolving something that will make up for the unpreparedness from which this country is now suffering.
