

BITS OF STATE NEWS

The annual meeting of the West Virginia Bar Association will be held at White Sulphur Springs, July 5 and 6. Papers are being prepared by some of the ablest lawyers of West Virginia to be read at this meeting, and it is the announced intention to make them of interest to the layman as well as the lawyer.

Durability of the books for use in the primary grades of the public schools of West Virginia will have much to do with the award of contracts for such books by the state school book board June 5.

Reports made by farm agents in various counties indicate that most land owners will raise crops this year than in any former year. Some have arranged to farm on a big scale who had devoted most of their time to stock raising in recent years.

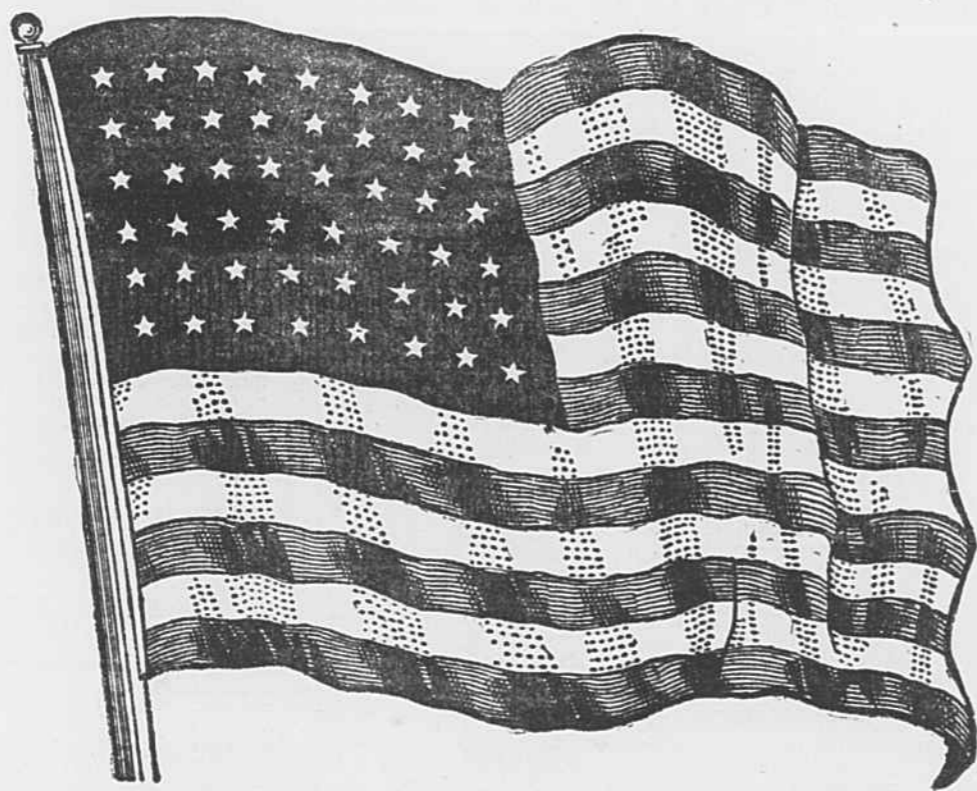
