PITTSBURGH, July 26.—On Fourth avenue, trading was limited, with the quotations firm. American Window Glass Machine common, with 75 shares sold at 53% rose 1/4 point. Independent Brewing common gained 1/4 to 1 1/2 and Pittsburgh Brewing preferred went up 1/2 point to 9 1/2.

U. S. Steel sold 25 shares at 707, a gain of 1%. Pittsburgh Oil and Gas, sold to the extent of 225 shares, lost 3/4 to 7 1/4. None of the other active stocks registered changes. In all 5,000 shares were sold, and \$1,050 of Liberty 4 1/2s, which sold off 20 cents to 95.46.

NEW YORK, July 26.—Except for the first and final hours, when dealings were moderately active, yesterday's stock market sounded the depths of mid-summer dullness.

The heavy buying towards the end was coincident with unofficial reports of fresh Allied gains along important sections of the western battle front.

Earlier war news exercised little effect on the market and latest peace rumors excited only languid interest in well informed banking circles.

Oil and Gas

In the Eastern fields more attention is being given to cleaning out old wells and drilling deeper than to looking for new territory, and while in the main the results are not more than a slight increase in the producing power of the wells, occasionally an agreeable surprise is met with and sometimes important developments are found in the lower strata.

The Cabin Creek development in Kanawha county, West Virginia, has furnished a striking example of the results of deeper drilling. In October 1916, the Mammoth Oil and Gas Company completed its initial test well on the W H Hudnell farm, located on the waters of Kelleys Creek and found a paying gas well in the Greer sand. The well has been a gasser ever since until drilled to deeper yesterday, when it started flowing oil at the rate of 60 barrels an hour. After flowing four to five hours at this rate, the well was shut in until tankage can be provided, which is being rushed as rapidly as possible. This is an important well in this field, as there are a number of gas wells owned by the United Fuel Gas Company and the Columbia Gas and Electric Company which have not been drilled deep enough to tap this pay.

In DeKalb district, Gilmer county, the South Penn Oil Company has completed its initial test well on the H A Gainer farm and has a five-barrel per day producer in the Big Injun sand.

In Grant district, Pleasants county, the Salt Farm Oil Company has completed its No 4 well on the M E Tait farm and it is dry in the Salt sand.

In Jefferson district, Pleasants county, the Baker Oil Company has completed its No 4 well on the J C Malone farm through the Salt sand and
