AMENDMENT

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska to be voted Platte experiences. upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 5th, A.D. 1918:

A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section one (1) of Article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska.

the State of Nebraska: Section 1. That Section One of Ar-

ticle Seven of the Constitution of the hereby is amended by striking out the medicine, following words "Second. Persons of foreign birth

who shall have declared their intention to become citizens comformably to the laws of the United States, on the subject of naturalization, at least thirty days prior to an election." And inserting in the place of the

words so stricken, the following words "Second. Persons of foreign birth

who shall have become citizens of the United States by naturalization or otherwise conformably to the laws of the United States at least thirty days 2.15 prior to an election.

Sec. 2. That at the general elec-.50 tion nineteen hundred and eighteen (1918) there shall be submitted to the 1.27 electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed 15.30 amendment to the constitution relat-10.42 ing to the right of suffrage. At such 5.61 election, on the ballot of each elector voting for or against said proposed amendment, shall be written or printed the words: "For proposed amendment to the constitution relating to ce Love, the right of suffrage," and "Against said proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of auffrage."

Sec. 3. If such amendment shall be approved by a majority of all d for the electors voting at such election, said Florence amendment shall constitute Section One (1) Article Seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska.
