A DISPATCH FROM ROBERTS.

London, February 20.—The war office has issued a dispatch from Roberts the main importance of which is the fact it is dated from Paardeburg, Monday. Paardeburg is thirty miles east of Jacobsdal. It announces that the railroad is open to Kimberly and that General Methuen will proceed there forthwith and large supplies will be forwarded.

RUMORS ARE UNCONFIRMED.

London, February 20.—Whatever news it has received the war office refuses to reveal. Unofficially it is reported that Kitchener has brought General Cronje to bay and has engaged him. It is inferred that the war office is merely awaiting a dispatch announcing the result of the battle. That story, however, though plausible, may be premature. The hope, however, prevails that General Cronje has been cut off from Bloombfontein.
