FORESTRY NOTES.

Washington, May 2, 1900.—Mr. Gifford Pinchot, forester of the department of agriculture, and Mr. F. V. Coville, botanist of the same department, will leave Washington for the west about May 15, to make a personal investigation of the problem of grazing in the forest reserves. The restriction of sheep grazing in these areas has raised a storm of protest from wool growers, and public feeling in the west has become divided and intense. A plan for an exhaustive investigation by the government was published a few weeks ago; but the tour of these officials will be the first actual work in the field.

They will meet at Holbrook, Arizona, by a committee consisting of A. E. Potter, of that city, who is secretary of the Arizona Wool Growers' association, and J. E. Bark, of Phoenix, who represents the cattle and irrigation interests. They will spend three weeks in the Black Mesa Preserve and then visit others in Arizona. The examination will be extended to other western reserves later in the summer.

Another interesting tract to come under government supervision is one of about 47,000 acres owned by the Adirondack League Club. It is in the Adirondack mountains of New York, near lower Saranack and is kept primarily as a game preserve. The work this plan will provide for the removal of all timber which can be spared without injuring the forest.

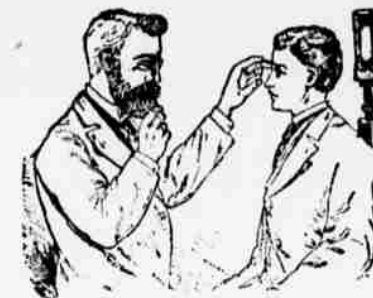
T. AND N. O. EXTENSION.
