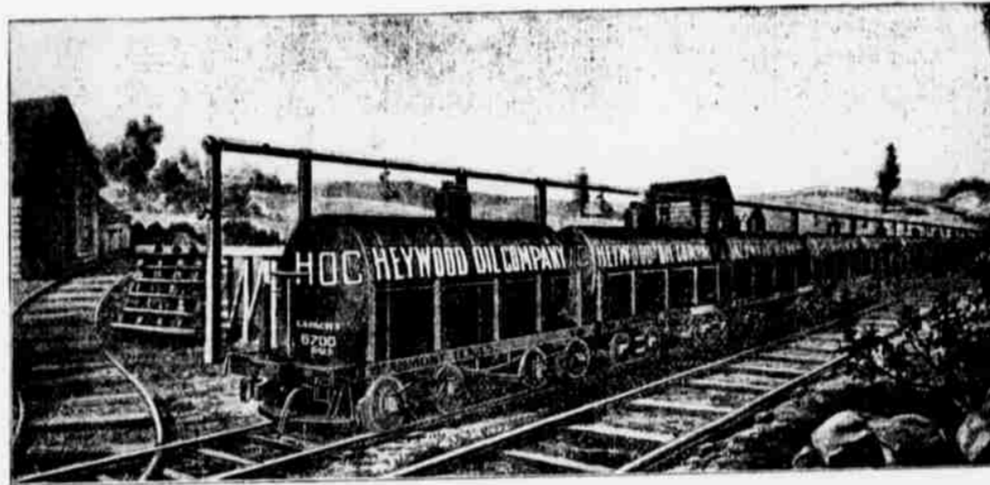

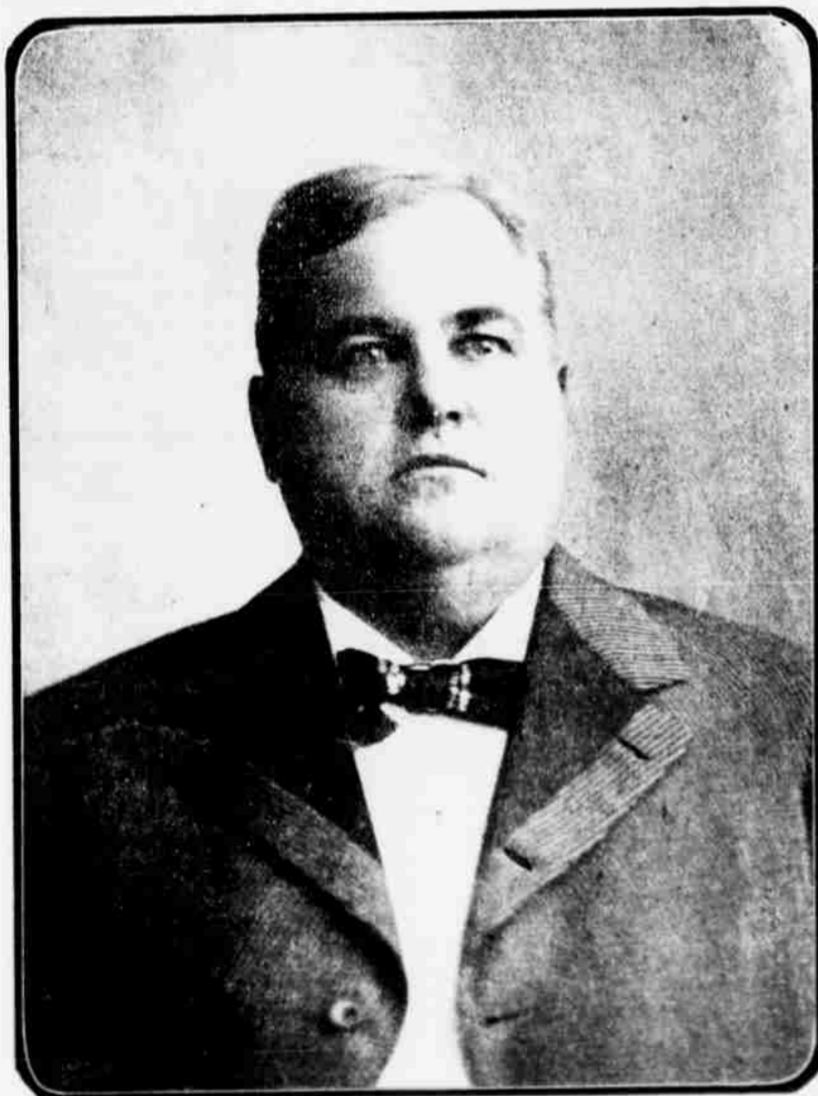

COL. S. E. MOSS.

This well known capitalist Col. S. E. Moss is a Texas product, having been born in Dallas county in 1857. He began his business career in Dallas in 1872. In 1878 he went to Bosque county and commenced the establishment of what became known as the Moss ranch, famous for its Durham stock and fine sheep. In 1880 he went to Cleburne, yet his home. He was for twenty years president of the National Bank of Cleburne and is vice president of the American National Bank of Oklahoma City and also vice president of First National bank Venus, Tex. owns the Cleburne cotton compress, and has other large interests in Texas. He is credited with having secured the removal of the Santa Fe shops from Galveston, Temple and other Texas points to Cleburne. His landed holdings are scattered over more than thirty counties in Texas. He is president of Texas and New Orleans, Ground Floor and Gulf Coast Oil companies. Colonel Moss came to Beaumont in May to organize a

National Bank, but on finding two here and two more about to open their doors, he turned his attention to speculation and bought ten acres in the Bullock league which he unloaded for just twice what it cost him. And then he caught the oil fever and it laid hold of him good. As a result he bought the now famous Kaiser Kelley property and 50 acres for \$125,000. The well coming in as dry as a powder house. Colonel Moss wrote his family that he would not go to Cleburne again until he struck oil. And so he organized the Texas and New Orleans Oil company with \$1,000,000 capital stock. Then he took hold of the Ground Floor proposition and pulled off a gusher on July 21. This well absorbed the Colonel from his work, and he made a 14-hour visit to Cleburne, returning to Beaumont where he now is. Colonel Moss was on the staff of Governor Culberson, and of Governor Sayers both terms, as Lieutenant Colonel. Those who know him best speak of him as the Duke of Cleburne.

SOLD FOR \$994,500.00.

Big Deal in Oil Lands Made by the Chicago-Beaumont Oil Company.

Yesterday J. R. Cheek sold to the Chicago-Beaumont Oil company six hundred and eleven acres of oil lands situated as follows:

One acre near the gushers.

One hundred acres at Oil City, this county, situated in the center of a triangle formed by Sour Lake, Spindle Top and the oil pool in the gulf.

Five hundred acres northwest of Beaumont on a line with Corsicana.

Ten acres in Brazoria county, near the Alvin developments.

The aggregate price for this land was \$994,500 and the deal was covered with revenue stamps from \$50 down to \$1 in value. This took nearly all the available stamps in the city.

The Chicago-Beaumont Oil Company will commence actual developments as soon as they can assemble the machinery and plant; the first well being scheduled to go down near this city.
