Explosion in an Austrian Coal Complaints filed Against Masters Mine Results in a Loss of at Least 100 Lives,<br>of Tugs That Failed to Aid Star of Bengal.

All the bodies of the dead miners have not yet been recovered, and the cause of the explosion and the full details of the mine disaster have not yet been learned, hence an accurate account cannot be given.
