A Trip to the Orient.

There are 2500 Europeans in Beyrouth. The Christians of Beyrouth who are gradully displacing the Meslem ele, ment are very industrious. Many of the firms have branch houses in England and France.

The most common language spoken after the Arabic is the French. There are 13 printing offices in Beyrouth. The best is that of the Jesuits, from a whole series of valuable works have been issued.

Twelve Arabic newspapers are printed. The Jesuits have a grand university and medical school with an attendance of about 2000. The largest Girl's school is that of the Sisters of Charity, which contains more than 2000 scholars; most of
