Many complaints are made that the government is too strict in its interpretation of homestead laws. Now that the government is making an attempt to conserve the public holdings for their legitimate purpose, that of providing homes for farmers there is anything but contentment in the minds of those who have figured on perjurying themselves at time of entry, cheating during supposed occupancy, and selling as soon as possible to some land shark, thus robbing the public domain of a farm which should have gone directly into the hands of a worthy seeker after an actual home.
