Anti-Nazi groups; but they do wish that "those Jews" would be less conspicuous in so many so-called liberal and radical movements; and, of course, they do not approve of a Jewish Homeland in Palestine for, after all, they are Americans and their home in America.

Strange to say, they would be quite resentful if anyone were to intimate that the odds are against their children's or their grandchildren's remaining Jews. Now, who are the Munichanos? They are a large, a too large, sector of American Jewry. They can be divided into several degrees or classes, but they have this one characteristic in common,—they deny most strenuously any assimilationist tendencies and stoutly maintain that they are Jews, good Jews, but modern and practical Jews, not old-fashioned, unworldly, ghetto-circumscribed Jews. And, to be truthful,

they are modern and practicalas modern and practical as Munich.

Most of these Munichanos are American-born sons and daughters of immigrant parents. Most of them were raised in what is euphemistically called a Jewish atmosphere,-meaning thereby that Orthodox or semi-Orthodox tradition was observed by "papa" and "momma" (the children today are mothers and dads).

Since "momma" and "papa" maintaining the home, improving their economic status and readjusting themselves to a new era and a different civilization, the children were fairly free to do as as they pleased when they reached adolescent years.

One matter, however, was not neglected; — the boys were prepared for Bar Mitzvah. 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
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
