In an effort, however, to lessen the risk of frontier incidents, Ru mania was reported reliably to have reached a tentative agreement with Russia under which the troops of each country will stay ten kilometers (6 1-4 miles) behind the border. The negotiations were said to have been carried on with the assistance of Adrien Thierry, French ambassador to Rumania, who is reported leaving for Paris tomorrow to make Nevertheless, many Rumanians ex-

pressed the fear that the Allies' preoccupation with Norway may encourage Russia to risk a quick aggressive adventure in southeastern Europe.

Others, however, believed British envoys returning to their Balkan posts after conferences in London will bring new assurances of full Allied support against attack from any quarter. The Allies already have given formal pledges to Rumania of nelp in the event of aggression.


