Alexandria Is Raided By Italian Warplanes

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, July 25.—(AP)—Italian planes, using incendiary bombs for the first time, raided this British naval base for an hour today. One person was killed and seven injured.

The bombs, missing military ob-jectives, fell in native residential districts. Numerous homes were se; afire.

The British struck back with a "highly successful" air raid on 50 grounded Italian planes at Derna, eastern Libya.

"All our bombs fell among them causing considerable damage", an RAF communique said.
