





Cover collectors are reopening an old field in censor markings. Collection of these items, which ended shortly after the Armistice in 1918, is in full stride again, with plenty of British Empire and German mail supplying demands. Overprints, natural result of war

and occupation of conquered territory, are increasing, but only a few are reaching United States. Recent addition was the "Free France" overprint of French colonials directing attention to General Charles de Gaulle's appeal to Frenchmen to defend the empire. The numerous German issues

bearing Hitler's portrait find no counterpart in the philatelic history of Kaiser Wilhelm, leader of the World War I. The kaiser's portrait appears on a single issue, the coronation stamp of 1900. He appears in a group and can hardly be identified.


