

Volunteer Women Center Efforts On Exceeding Goals

With just one more week remaining for completion of E bond quotas during the sixth war loan campaign, women victory volunteer salesmen will concentrate even more earnestly than before on having their respective counties top their E bond goals, it was announced yesterday by Mrs. Karl Bishopric, of Spray, chairman of the women's division of the North Carolina war finance committee.

A number of counties and regions have accepted as their objectives the selling of sufficient E, F and G bonds to pay for B-29 Superfortresses at \$600,000 each. Mrs. Bishopric reported. Some of these have already attained their goal, for others it is within sight, while still others will redouble

their efforts to make their goals. A plaque bearing the name of the sponsoring county or group will be placed on each Superfortress for the Army Air forces thus paid for with war bond sales; and a United States Treasury certificate will be presented to the various organizations thus successfully completing their B-29 war bond purchase goals.

In celebration of this achievement, a small model of a Superfortress will be presented by the women's division to the State of North Carolina for display in the Hall of History at Raleigh. Plans are being made for a public program for this purpose during the month of January in Raleigh.

Although confident that their campaigns will culminate successfully by December 30, the women war bond leaders and workers are taking no chances and will continue to push E, F and G bond sales to individuals throughout the next week.

Now that the drive to sell bonds as Christmas gifts has been finished, attention will be paid to the sale of E bonds as year-end bonuses for employees of business con-

V-mail bond certificates for servicemen, bonds for babies and other investments in E bonds will be especially featured, to help put every county in North Carolina over its E bond quota. Women enlisted in the Blue Star Brigade for selling E, F or G bonds are winning campaign ribbon decorations by the scores for their sale of bonds to as many as ten different persons.

As their bond sales mount, their rank in the brigade rises from second lieutenant to general. The woman selling bonds to the largest number of persons in each county will be designated as the County General, and the one making the best record in the state will be designated as the State General.
