Makes Statement

Sheriff Reynolds said that Mc-Leod said in his tatement that: He went to the Lowery home about dark on July 1 and told Koonce that there was "a bear out there," and when the youth went to get a shotgun and shells, McLeod shot him with a .22 caliber

He said he saw Mrs. Lowery lying on a bed and shot her before she could get up, and then he shot the baby.

McLeod said he then waited until Lowery drove up and shot him as he walked into the kitchen of his

Set House Afire

Then, McLeod said, he poured kerosene over the floor of the house and over the bodies, lighted the kerosene and walked out the back door as the house burst into Sheriff Reynolds said that foot-

prints - later identified as Mc-Leod's-were found leading from the Lowery house into a nearby woods. A .22 caliber rifle was found at McLeod's home, the sher-Suspected Foul Play

Sheriff Reynolds said that he suspected "foul play" on his first visit to the scene, and he called on the State Bureau of Investigation for assistance. SBI Agent Lee P. Phillips was sent to Scotland county and aided the local officers in securing evidence.

McLeod has been taken to an undisclosed jail for safekeeping, and is being held without bond, the sheriff said.


