

### REGIONAL OFFICER IN CITY FOR TALKS

#### Insurance Expert To Aid Veterans Solve Problems

In Wilmington today for a series of talks and discussions with local veterans about their insurance, E. C. Bailey, regional insurance officer for the Veterans Administration, is expected to clear up all general and some detailed questions asked by veterans.

Meeting with a large crowd of veterans last night in the Veterans of Foreign Wars hall at eight o'clock, the Greensboro official told the ex-servicemen their exact status quo on varied and sundry insurance problems with which they are confronted.

**Speaking Agenda**

His speaking agenda while in the city includes a speech before the Wilmington Lions today at one o'clock, at that group's annual installation of officers in a local cafeteria.

The insurance officer will discuss National Service Life Insurance as a special public service presentation over station WMFD between 3:30 and 3:45 o'clock this afternoon.

Wilmington Veterans Service Committee and Wilmington Life Underwriters organization members will hear Bailey during an open forum discussion at four o'clock this afternoon when that body meets in the Community Chest conference rooms, fourth floor, Tide Water building.

Closing his speaking tours of the city at eight o'clock tonight, Bailey will address a mass meeting of Negro veterans in St. Luke's Seventh and Church street assembly room. The last speech is under the sponsorship of the Wilmington Negro American Legion post.

### SEARCH CONTINUES FOR MISSING PAIR; POLICE LACK CLUE

A wide-spread search for two young girls was continued last night by city, county and state officers.

Police reported no trace of two missing girls, following a 15 hour hunt prompted by a report from James Smith, Folkstone, who said his daughter and sister had disappeared from their home.

Reporting the two as having been absent from their residence since July 2, the Folkstone man described them as his sister, Frances Smith, 22, height, five feet, weight 135, blue eyes, auburn hair and fair complexion; his daughter, Bonnie Lee Smith, 16, height, five feet; weight 100 pounds; blue eyes and blonde hair.

Smith was unable to give further description of the two young women, or what they were wearing when last seen.

### CIVITAN MEMBERS HEAR W. C. HAAS

#### Intricate Procedure Of Grading Food Handlers Explained

The intricate procedure of grading and inspecting food handling establishments was explained to Wilmington Civitans at their regular luncheon meeting yesterday by W. C. Haas, sanitary inspector for the city-county health board and the state board of health.

Passing around score sheets used in the grading of restaurants, Haas gave a brief summary of the procedure and some of the problems met in his work.

**Grading**

On a basis of 1,000 points for a perfect record, eating places may be graded in "A", "B", and "C" classifications, with the "A" grade being from 900 to 1,000, "B" from 800 to 900 and "C" from 700 to 800, he disclosed.

Any eating place falling below the 700 mark must be closed until proper conditions can be established, he added.

**Six Billion Meals**

Pointing out the necessity of proper food handling and eating place cleanliness, the inspector revealed that approximately six billion meals are served annually in the United States.

"Infected food can cause illness and death," Haas said.

"On December 31, 1945, there were 745 food handling establishments in New Hanover county. . . . On June 30, 1946 there were 823 such places in the county," he disclosed.

"Eating out is a necessity for many people and they must be protected," he added.

#### Kiwanis Club Hears Vocational Talk By Fellow Members

Members of the Wilmington Kiwanis club who braved the down-pour of rain at noon yesterday to attend the regular weekly luncheon meeting, got a clearer word picture of the ministry as a vocation from a fellow member, the Rev. Edgar B. Fisher, pastor of Trinity Methodist church and all came away with a better understanding of the many tasks which confront the "cloth" not one, but seven days each week.

#### Have Jobs

Today they are students in colleges, vocational enthusiasts, or have completed their preliminary education and have been placed in jobs which allow them to become self supporting.

Many come from "well-off" families, and are usually hard pressed for rehabilitation, and the counsel which the service affords, Chiemiago, said.

### VOCATIONAL WORK Rehabilitation Worker Helping Hopeless Here

Civilian clientele numbering 94 has been registered as new customers of the Civilian Vocational Rehabilitation service during the past six months.

These customers of a state and federal sponsored organization today are receiving invaluable aid through the service's "personalized" counseling, Albert A. Chiemiago, counselor, said.

#### Offices Opened

The local territory was served by a representative who made periodic visits to Wilmington from Greenville until six months ago when Chiemiago opened offices and organized his system here.

In this number of new customers, many were mentally depressed, others were amputees, and still others were suffering from some major ailment and had been approved for the service of the agency.

#### In All States

The CVR service is provided in all states for men and women of all ages, race, color and creed, who have disabilities which prevent them from earning a living.

The service uses as its guide, four major principles to appeal to the person who has been injured. They are: medical treatment, hospital care, artificial appliances and training guidance.

"If you are handicapped by an accident; if you are mentally ill, you can fit yourself for work, and get yourself in shape to do your part in a world of peace. It's not what you have lost, but what you have left, as rehabilitation builds on what you can do," the counselor advises.

### SOUTH EAST SEEKS LUXURY AIRPLANES

#### Company Negotiating For New 27 Passenger Liners

South East Airlines, the State "feeder" airline which serves Wilmington, is negotiating for several new DC-3 luxury liners to add to its fleet, it was announced yesterday by Douglas Blythe, general passenger traffic manager.

**27 Passengers**

The new planes, like the DC-3's already in service, will accommodate 27 passengers plus the crew, Blythe said.

A sharp increase in the demand for air transportation from cities throughout the state necessitates the extra air liners, Blythe continued.

Since the company instituted its new policy of seats-by-reservation only, the demand for seats has boomed, Blythe explained, because people are certain of getting seats now whereas they had no guarantee of getting them under the old first-come-first-served plan.

### SCOTLAND NEGRO ADMITS KILLINGS

#### Signs Statement That He Shot Four Persons To Death July 1

LAURINBURG, July 10. —(AP)—Sheriff W. D. Reynolds said Wednesday that Benjamin Frank McLeod, 27-year-old Negro, had admitted in a signed statement that he shot and killed four persons and then set fire to their farm home to destroy evidence of the killings.

The victims were: Henry Lowery, 45; his wife; their 18-month-old son, William Kenneth Lowery; and George Edward Koonce, 17 farm hand employed by Lowery.

Their charred bodies were found in the ruins of their five-room farm house in a lonely section 12 miles north of here on the night of July 1.

Reynolds said that McLeod had stoutly denied his guilt until this week. The sheriff quoted McLeod as saying that there had been "trouble" between him and Lowery sometime ago, and that the day before the slayings he had heard that Lowery had threatened to shoot him.

#### Makes Statement

Sheriff Reynolds said that McLeod said in his statement that: He went to the Lowery home about dark on July 1 and told Koonce that there was "a bear out there," and when the youth went to get a shotgun and shells, McLeod shot him with a .22 caliber rifle.

He said he saw Mrs. Lowery lying on a bed and shot her before she could get up, and then he shot the baby.

McLeod said he then waited until Lowery drove up and shot him as he walked into the kitchen of his home.

#### Set House Afire

Then, McLeod said, he poured kerosene over the floor of the house and over the bodies, lighted the kerosene and walked out the back door as the house burst into flame.

Sheriff Reynolds said that footprints—later identified as McLeod's—were found leading from the Lowery house into a nearby woods. A .22 caliber rifle was found at McLeod's home, the sheriff added.

#### Suspected Foul Play

Sheriff Reynolds said that he suspected "foul play" on his first visit to the scene, and he called on the State Bureau of Investigation for assistance. SBI Agent Lee P. Phillips was sent to Scotland county and aided the local officers in securing evidence.

McLeod has been taken to an undisclosed jail for safekeeping, and is being held without bond, the sheriff said.

### Lichfield Brutality Trials Near Close

BAD NAUHEIM, July 10. —(AP)—The Lichfield brutality trials Wednesday moved into their final phases with a boxscore showing 10 convictions and one acquittal with five more trials to be completed.

The defendants, including enlisted men and officers, are charged with gross brutality in the treatment of prisoners confined to the detention barracks at the Lichfield depot in Britain last fall and were transferred here as a result of angry charges and counter-charges that the army planned to "whitewash" high officers and place the blame on prison guards and other low-ranks.
