BLACK MAREKTING DEALT HARD BLOW

U. S. Army Substitutes Script For Paying Italy Personnel

ROME, Saturday, Sept. 14 -(P) - In a surprise move aimed at curbing military black marketeers, Mediterranean and European theater headquarters of the U. S. Army early today declared a 72-hour moratorium on virtually all soldiers' financial transactions. The moratorium was declared to

permit substitution of a new currency - "military payment certificates" - in place of local cur-

Under the moratorium, which effects all transactions except the settlement of mess accounts and payments by departing personnel and authorized transients, all military personnel will surrender local surrency shown in their currency control passbooks for the new certificates. These will be issued in denominations of five, 10, 25 and 50 cents and \$1, \$5 and \$10.


