Whereas, Objects of interest in the United States require that the Senate should be convened at an early day, to receive and act upon such I might wish myself again into communications as may be made to it on the part of the Executive:

Now, therefore, I Chester A. Ar thur, President of the United States, have considered it to be my duty to issue this my proclamation, declaring that an extraordinary occasion requires the Senate of the United States to convene for the transaction of business, at the Capitol, in the city of Washington, on Monday, October 10th, next, at noon on that day, of which all who shall at that time be entitled to act as members of that body are hereby required to take notice.

Given under my hand and the scal of the United States, at Washington, he twenty third day of September, in the year of our Lord 1881, and of the Independence of the United States the One Hundred and Sixth. CHESTER A. ARTHUR.


