EXPLODING GUN KILLS TWO AMERICAN SOLDIERS

Accident At Fort Casey, Near Port Townsend. Strikes Down Gun Crew While At Target Practice—Three Injured

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.] Port Townsend, June 7.—Two soldiers were killed and three seriously injured by an accident during target practice at Fort Casey yesterday. An eight inch gun blew out its breech block and the fragments cut down the gun crew.

WILL QUIT

Lord Minto Will Vacate Government House

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.] Ottawa, June 7.—Lord and Lady Minto will vacate the government house the second week in October, the governor general having determined not to serve longer in Canada than the present summer and fall.

Lord Onslow is named as Minto's probable successor.

KILL MANY

Dynamiters At Work In Colorado

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.] Colorado Springs, June 7.—An explosion at Independence Station on the Florence and Cripple creek railway in the Cripple creek district killed 16 people and injured nine fatally. All were miners. A stick of dynamite was laid under the station platform and set off by the incoming train. Detectives are working on the case. The militia has been ordered out and trouble is expected.

THEY WIN

British Carry Things Own Way In Thibet

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.] London, June 7.—Telegraphic advices from Simla say the British expedition to Thibet has captured two four pounders and a Lhasa general reported killed. The Thibetans refused to forward the letter of Col. Younghusband, fixing the latest date at which the British are prepared to meet and negotiate with the Thibetan delegation at Gyantse before advancing on Lhasa. An ordering, Younghusband has caused it to be made known the time limit which he has set, hoping this would reach Lhasa indirectly. After that time there will be no treating except by capitulation.

FOUR JAP SHIPS SAID TO HAVE BEEN SUNK

Rumored That Russian Port Arthur Squadron Made Disasterous Attack Upon Enemy's Fleet Saturday Morning

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.] Liaoyang, June 7.—It is persistently rumored that the Russian Port Arthur squadron had made a sortie shortly before dawn Saturday. The Russian destroyer Kendalig found the Japanese unsuspecting the presence of hostile warships and the result was the sinking of four Japanese ships.

Fighting Agass at Port Arthur

Liaotung, June 7.—Persistent rumors are current that another great battle is in progress near Port Arthur. A continuous cannonading is heard from the south. An additional 16,000 Japanese reported as landed at Takushan.
