Passenger Boat for Down Stream Friday

Whitehorse, August 3.—The next boat for Dawson will be the Dawson Friday night. The Whitehorse sailed at 11:30 last night with 35 passengers and a full cargo of freight. The Casca will sail tonight.

The Bonanza King was at Lower Laberge at 6 a. m. and will arrive this evening. The Canadian was at Yukon Crossing at 7 a. m. She will arrive here tomorrow. The Dawson was at Selwyn, coming up, at 11:30 p. m. yesterday.

The Victorian in tied up at Whitehorse.

The Bonanza King will turn back with mail service freight for Pelly river and way points.

The river is 48 inches above low water.

Chief Justice Hunter Will Hold General Court

Chief Justice Hunter, of the British Columbia supreme court, arrived on the Princess Beatrice, and will proceed to Atlin Friday for the purpose of holding court in that place. Justice Hunter is accompanied by several barristers from Vancouver and other British Columbian points. Among the latter are A. J. Kappeler, A. D. Taylor, Edgar Bloomfield and A. T. Willis Solomon, all of Vancouver.

It is thought that the present term of the general court will not be continued as long as have some of the sessions in that district, though Justice Hunter will remain there as long as there is business to do.
