PEOPLE SHOULD ACT

A Washington dispatch calls attention to the fact that the Dietrich bill was recommended for passage by the United States senate committee on territories and that it will be pressed for passage at the next session of congress.

This means that the people of Alaska should get busy between the present and the next meeting of the national legislature. The Dietrich bill must not be permitted to pass in its present shape.

This iniquitous measure contains the abominable Platt amendment, which says the bill shall not be construed to mean that Alaska or any portion of its territory ever shall be admitted to statehood. It also provides that the governor shall be the representative of the district in congress, and that a majority of the legislative commission shall be appointed. In other words it blacklists American citizenship in Alaska.

The people can prevent the passage of any such bill. Let its iniquities be laid bare and it will fall.
