The Secret of Blondin's Success.

[From the N. Y. Century, Aug. 71.]

The wonderful power that Blondin possesses of balancing himself is the point of curiosity and amazement to the crowd. By explaining a little of the philosophy of this feat we may lessen the satonishment of some people, and perhaps remere the chief difficulty to a rational amount of self-culture, resulting in an improvement of the nervous system. The common toy, of a man spinning on the point of a wire, explains the whole matter. The centre of gravity is lowered to the base, and there it is easily preserved. The use of the pole answers the same purpose. Blondin's pole is thirty-four feet long, and weighs forty-six pounds. Held below the middle of the body, it brings his centre of gravity sufficiently mear to the rope, to be easily controlled. A very slight elevation of one and and a corresponding depression of the other restores the balance of the body.

The skill to govern the position, by an eract movement of the pole to the required extent, and not an inch further, results from practice. Those who have seen "the infant phenomenon" of the Ravel troupe on the tight-rope, must have observed the immerfect inverse, and The Secret of Blondin's Success.

Those who have seen "the infant phenomenon of the Barel troupe on the tight-rope, mus have observed the imperfect management of the pole in less experienced hands. Philosophical 17, Blondin and his pole constitute one body and the extension laterally of its weight is equivalent to lowering the centre of gravity, oe allarging the base on which he walks. Bergen Tunnel.

[From the American Railway Review.]

Bergen Tunnel, now being bored through Bergen Hill, about a mile and a half from Jersey Citr, for the use of the New York and Erie Railway Company, is forty-three hundred feet long. The extreme height of the opening is twenty-three feet, and the width of the grade of the roadway is twenty-eight feet. The cross-section contains 500 6-10 superficial feet, the cubic contents being 211 yards per lineal foot, nearly. The rool is an arch of three centres, rising thirteen feet and six inches from the springing, at which point the width is twenty-nine leet and six inches. The grade of the tunnel is two-tenths of a foot per hundred, ascending from the east approach for about two-thirds of the whole length, when t changes to sixteen hundredths of a foot per hundred, descending towards the west approach. The drainage is carried by a covered drain between the tracks, the bottom of which is two feet below the railway.

The whole length of the born is though two

The whole length of the bore is through trap rock. The root is perfectly solid, and with the exception of one or two points, will require no support. The hill on the Jersey City or east side, is very abrupt, so that the open cut at the approach is not more than two hundred feet long; the depth at the commencement of the tunnel being about fifty feet. The hill on the west side is more gradual in its descent, and the tunnel is approached from that side by a deep earth cut about half a mile long. The solid rock is struck at about two hundred feet from the mouth of the tunnel; the depth of the cut at the entrance being fifty four feet.

There are eight shafts, varying in depth from eighty to ninety feet, which, with the two mouths of the tunnel, give eighteen different points to work from. The boisting is performed by steam power, and the rock is taken to the cast side of the hill in cars, which are run down an inclined plane, to the low ground, from which point they are hauled by a locomotive to the Hudson river, and there the rock is used for filling in what is called the Long Dock, where the New York and Eric Railway terminus will finally be. The tunnel, it is expected, will be finished during the winter of 1850—60.
