After the annual meeting and election of officers of the Pearl Harbor Traction company, reported in yesterday's Star-Bulletin, President L. J. Tenney Peck lost no time in getting things going. As mentioned yesterday and previously, the necessary contract between the company and the superintendent of public works had been long in abeyance. Mr. Peck took this matter up first, and after a conference of two hours with Governor Frear came away with the document in his pocket.
