the Lehua sailed on Thursday after-
noon.

SHIPPING NEWS

The Lehua leaves Lahaina for Hono-
lulu this morning, and the Kinai will
touch at Maalaea bay tonight about
ten o'clock for Honolulu.
The Wilder Steamship Company's
vessels Lehua, Kinai, Kailani and
Hawaii, have been inspected and
passed by the steam boat inspectors.
The Sierra, which was due in Hono-
lulu on Wednesday had not reached
there when the Lehua left on Thurs-
day afternoon. She is supposed to
have been detained at San Francisco,
waiting for the English mail.
The Bark Wrestler, 89 days out
from Newcastle for Kahului, is mak-
ing the second longest passage of the
season the Bark prince Louis holding
the record. The Wrestler has proba-
bly become becalmed off Hawaii and
is trying to beat up to Kahului.
The Kinai will not leave Hilo this
week until Saturday on account of
an unusually large number of tour-
ists for Hilo and the volcano. She
will arrive in Honolulu next Sunday
morning about 10 a. m. The idea is
to give the passengers a day longer
at Hilo.
The rumor reached Wailuku that
the Maui, Capt. Bennett, struck a
rock at Kipahulu on Thursday, which
started a very serious leak. Conse-
quently the Maui left Hana yesterday
morning for Honolulu direct, only
calling at Kahului yesterday afternoon
long enough to get her ship's papers
and pick up whatever mail was
to be sent.
