FOREIGN NEWS.

WASHINGTON, D. C. Oct. 3.—Secretary of the Treasury Shaw today informed Secretary George R. Carter that he would accept bonds of the Hawaiian loan of \$1,229,000 as security for national bank deposits and circulation up to 90 per cent. of their face value. This places the Hawaiian bonds on the same basis as United States bonds.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Oct. 6.—The Nippon Maru was placed in quarantine on her arrival here today. No sickness was reported on board the steamer after its departure from Honolulu. It is anticipated that the ship will be released after a thorough fumigation.

PARIS, France, Oct. 6.—Despatches received here today state that the Japanese fleet has been sent to Massanpo for a cruise but no troops have been landed.

It is generally conceded that Russia will not evacuate Manchuria, as promised, on the 8th of October, and it is believed negotiations are in progress that will possibly obviate the objections by Japan to Russia's continued presence in Manchuria. These negotiations are said to concede Japan a foothold in Korea.

YOKOHAMA, Japan, Oct. 7.—Information from the Japanese Embassy at Peking is of a most disquieting nature. It is asserted that Russia has informed China that it will not evacuate Manchuria unless its demands upon China are granted. The Chinese Government has appealed to Japan for assistance in combating Russian aggression.

TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

Fifteen silver chalices are missing from St. Peter's, Rome.

Eugene Dempsey, one of the best known lawyers in San Francisco, died on Monday.

Tammany has nominated George Mc-Clellan for mayor and E. M. DeWitt for comptroller.

Tornadoes and cyclones destroyed much life and property in Illinois and Wisconsin on Monday.

The British Admiralty has decided to build fifteen new torpedo-boat destroyers of the latest type.

China has refused the request of France to be allowed to station troops in Nanking. Trouble may result.

The Duke of Devonshire has offered his resignation as Lord President of Council. The resignation was accepted.

In the postal scandal, indictments were found this week against James N. Tyner, at one time postmaster general.

Twenty Turkish villages were burned in the Raglog district, after a battle in which 2,000 Turks were slaughtered.

An order has been issued by the War Department placing General Henry C. Corbin in command of the Department of the East.

It is now generally conceded that Russia will not evacuate Manchuria, and that Japan has been satisfied with concessions in Korea.

It is reported that the entire Christian population at Mohomia has been massacred. It is known that there were 3,200 Bulgarians there.

The insane man who recently injured a guard in an attempt to reach Roosevelt at Washington has been confined in the Insane Asylum.

The legislative body for the Moro provinces has passed a very stringent law against slavery, which has existed among the Moros for years.

A new Servian cabinet has been formed with Grucia as premier. Grucia was not a member of what was termed the "Assassin Cabinet."

The British Government does not anticipate an outbreak between Russia and Japan. The Oriental situation is regarded as quite satisfactory.

There is a prospect that the consuls of foreign countries who are stationed in Macedonia may form the council to administer the proposed reforms.

The action of the Japanese Government in sending two regiments of Infantry to Korea is not regarded as an unfriendly act in Russian official circles.

Hon. Joseph Chamberlain has issued a manifesto dealing with the issues before the British public which brought about his resignation as secretary for the Colonies.

Negotiations in regard to the Philippine lands between the United States and the Valican have been called off, and will be renewed directly between Rome and Washington.

At the close of the conference between the Czar of Russia and the Emperor of Austria, a joint note was issued in which the two monarchs pledged the strength of their countries in attempting to secure Macedonian reforms.

Emissaries sent by President Castro of Venezuela have arrived at Ciudad Bolivar with orders to collect by forcible means if necessary the customs duties, amounting to a million dollars, part of which has already been paid by the foreign merchants to the revolutionists.

Premier Balfour has completed the organization of his new cabinet as follows: Wm. St. John F. Broderick as secretary for India; Austen Chamberlain, Chancellor of Exchequer; Alfred Lyttleton, Secretary for the Colonies; Arnold Foster, secretary of War, Graham Murray, chief secretary for Scotland, and Lord Stanley, Postmaster General.
