His assertion that they were issued because the mandate of the Court had been contemptiously defled is simply false. The officers against whom Durell's Injunction was issued scruppilously obeyed it—so scrupously, indeed, that their failure to compite and canvass the returns, the consequent absence of official information as to the vote, is made a conspicuous point to Grant's defense of his conduct. So, too, the assertion that it was only made known to him that the process of the United States Court was resisted, and that he used the army to execute the process "according to the judgement of the Court exaction that it was only made the court was resisted. The value of his mining interests in Nevada is almost beyond the power of figures to express. He is principal owner of the great "Bonanza" silver mine, which is valued at the interesting sum of \$300,000,000,000 and the profits of which, according to his own estimate, will be from \$150,000,000 to \$200,000,000.
