In 1880 the total vote on the State ticket was 718,186, or 3,278 votes less than this year. The total Presidential vote the same year was 724,077, or only 3,568 votes more than this year. In 1880 Garilleid's majority over Hancock was 34,227. Governor, Hoadly's majority over Forsker is 1,5,79—a difference in favor of the Demomracy of 46,736.

Last year, when the Democratic plurality was 19,000, the total Republican vote was only 297,759. 
