FRENCH PREMIER MEETS DEMANDS OF U. S. BANKERS

Herriot Promises Ruhr Evacuation on

Oct. 15.

LONDON, July 28.—Under pressure from an American-British banking group, France has yielded her rights to separate action and Pre-mier Herriot proposes to offer military exacuation of the Ruhr on Oct. 15, according to reliable information

This is regarded as the turning point in the inter-allied reparations conference, which now only awaits a formal offer from France to this effect, before going ahead with the machinery of the experts' plan. Proposal Secret


