right of way and all his claim for damages to his land.

The request of the pineapple cannery people to be supplied with 50,000 gallons of water per day for the use of their cannery, which will be temporarily put up at Kapaa, after careful consideration, was deferred until next meeting for definite action.

The Board upon request of the County road supervisor for instructions, by a vote ordered that after the completion of the present macadamizing work at Waikoko the rock crusher and outfit be moved to Lumahai and the macadamizing work from there to Haena be proceeded with to completion.

Of the Board's own motion the pipe of the Lawai water works was ordered to be extended along the short-cut road in Koloa district.

A Freak Bill Killed

The bill introduced in the house of Representatives, providing for government loans up to \$500 to homesteaders, was reported upon adversely by the finance committee and thereupon killed.

Dr. Derby's Office

Work began last week on the new dental office of Dr. A. J. Derby, next to Frank Crawford's residence, Lihue. When it is completed, the carpenters will begin work on the residence cottage of the dentist, which will go on the same lot.

Pau "Neptune"

The film series "Neptune's Daughter," which had been exploited in the various theaters of the island for ten days, went back to Honolulu Saturday night, the agent for it, J. Dias, returning at the same time. It is understood that, on the whole, the picture made money for the people bringing it over, there being only one real slim audience.

Ship Frye Known Here

The American ship W. M. P. Frye, which was captured and sunk by the German auxiliary cruiser Prince Eitel Friedrich, in the Atlantic, was well known in these islands. Prior to the days of the big American-Hawaiian steamers, she was regularly engaged in carrying Hawaiian sugar from island ports around the Horn. At the time she was overhauled and sunk, she carried a cargo of wheat from Puget Sound, destined for Ireland. The German auxiliary afterward put into Newport News, Virginia, for repairs.

FOR REMOVAL OF PUBLIC OFFICERS

Following is Senate Bill 24, which seeks to amend Section 1552 of the Revised Laws of 1915, concerning the removal of public officers for cause:

Section 1552. Procedure. Any elected or appointed county officer, including a supervisor, may be removed for malfeasance, nonfeasance or maladministration in office. Any circuit court within the county shall be a court of impeachment for the trial of any such elected or appointed officer who may be so charged, and such circuit court shall sit without a jury and shall proceed according to the form required for the trial of all civil cases at common law as modified by statute. A certified petition setting forth in detail the charges preferred against such officer and praying for his removal may be filed in such circuit court by not less than twenty-five persons who are citizens and voters of the county and thereupon the court shall fix the time within which the officer charged shall answer the charges but in no case less than twenty days from date of service, and, a certified copy of such charges together with a proper summons shall be served upon the officer, so charged as in any civil case. If such officer shall fail to appear and answer on or before the return day he may be defaulted and the court may, after default, hear the petitioners upon their proof and, if the charges are sustained, may remove the officer and his office shall thereupon become vacant; but if the officer shall on or before the return day appear and file a written reply to the charges either in the form of a demurrer or traverse, the issues formed by the reply shall, after notice, be set down and heard by the court and the cause shall proceed to final termination as in other civil law causes. If it shall be finally adjudged that the charges are unfounded in law or in fact the respondent may recover his costs; but if the charges are adjudged to be founded upon both law and fact the court shall adjudge the office to be vacant and award the costs against the respondent. The board of supervisors, unless provision is otherwise made by law, shall fill such vacancy by the appointment of some other person to the office, unless the removed officer shall be a supervisor, when the office shall be filled by the Governor.

Francis Hanify Calls

The chartered steamer Francis Hanify arrived at Port Allen early Friday morning from Honolulu, bringing 600 tons of freight. She sailed at 6 o'clock the same afternoon for Kahului, not taking any cargo from Kauai.

Show Had Bad Luck

The Dainty Company had hard luck with their show in Waimea Wednesday evening. A man with a parlor rifle, prize shooting gallery opened that evening on the road to the theater and held up a large crowd, while the big political rally, with the Waimea brass band, down below, engaged the balance of the town, leaving nothing for the show. After vainly waiting for awhile for an audience, the show people gave up their program for the night.

Temporary Cannery

Albert Horner has addressed a letter to the stockholders of the Hawaiian Canneries Company stating that the new cannery at Kapaa will be a temporary structure only, and that a larger, permanent cannery will be put up nearer Lihue as soon as the proposed Waipouli railroad goes through. It is understood that the rush arrangement is made necessary by the large output of cannable pineapples which will be coming along in May and June.
