A house lined with building paper is far cooler than one that is not. There is also a cheaper grade of paper adapted for use under matting keeping out insects.

Have you a leaky gutter? If you have, make it perfectly clean and dry, apply a good coat of No. 3 P. and B. 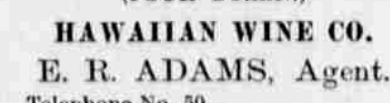
