THE LOG-BOOK

The S. S. Aorangi departed for the Colonies at 9 p. m. on Saturday.
The American schooner Borealls arrived from Port Ludlow on Saturday afternoon.
The S. S. Mexican is due from San Francisco today.
The S. S. Hyades is due from Seattle today.
The steamships Korea and Lurline should arrive from San Francisco on Wednesday.
The transport Thomas is due from San Francisco on Wednesday.
There are a dozen merchant vessels in port at present.
Captain Phillips, commander of the S. S. Aorangi, has made seventy-six voyages, traveling 1,141,000 miles. He, Purser Coxall and other of the officers will continue to visit this port aboard another C.-A. liner.
Among the Aorangi's cargo were twelve young moose consigned to a New Zealand preserve.
The S. S. Lurline is bringing to this port 2500 tons of cargo, including twenty autos. She has 156 bags of mail for here and 600 tons of freight for Kahului.
The S. S. Alameda will bring down over a dozen autos on her next trip here.
