An OLD Cotn .- A coin has just been discovered in a wood near Etain, France. It is a coin of Philip II., King of Macedon, father of Alexander the Great, who reigned from the year 559 to 556 B. C. Thus the money is upwards of 2,000 years old.

The King of Denmark has recently ordered the vigorous prosecution of researches in the Nydamm Morass, in Sundewitt. Objects of artiquity of various kinds have lately been found there. They are stated to belong mostly to the second and third centuries. In a course of six hours' search, besides a large Gothic vessel of war, a boat of nearly 80 feet in length was brought to light. Various weapons were found at the same time, some of them lying in the boat, others around it, among which were an iron arrow-head and three swords, with rare bronze ornaments on the sheaths. The excavations are going on with success.


