We have no change to notice in this sale. The demand is only moderate and prices unchanged. Sales comprise 400 sacks at \$1.40 for No. 1, 200 at \$1.35 for No. 2, 200 at \$1.30 for No. 3. There has been nothing doing for a retail trade at \$2.40/45 for round hog, and \$2.25/30 for fat for prime do. There is a fair demand for No. 1 and No. 2. The market continues very quiet, with no notable change in prices. There were sales of 300 lbs. prime meat to the government at 10 c. lb. We quote choice meat at \$21.25/30 for shoulders, and retailing at \$34.75/35 for 10 c. Sides and ribbed sides are very quiet. There is a fair retail demand and prices unchanged. There were sales of 100 lbs. in firm at 12c. for ribbed sides and 13c./12c. for fat. There is a fair demand for No. 1 and No. 2 for shoulders. Sides and loaves are in fair demand, with only a moderate demand at 19c. for No. 1 and 18c. for No. 2. There were sales of 200 lbs. for sides, 20c. for plain hams, 20c./25c. for sugar cured hams, 20c. for No. 1, 19c. for No. 2. There were sales to-day of 15 cases of sides at 12c./c. lbs. There were sales of 100 lbs. in firm to full supply, but dull at 12c./12c. for No. 1 and 11c./11c. for No. 2. There were sales of 200 lbs. for hogs. The retail price for No. 1 is 12c. for sides and 11c. for loaves.
