L. W. Cureton to Phoenix
L. W. Cureton, business manager of the Coconino Farm Bureau, left for Phoenix in the interest of the Bureau, Wednesday. His special purpose is that of finding a market for Coconino County potatoes. The farmers of the Bureau have pooled together and will market their spuds by the car load, all of the potatoes bearing the mark of the Coconino County Farm Bureau and the name of the grower. If the Phoenix market proves insufficient to take care of this year's crop, Mr. Cureton will go on to Tucson. The present paying price for Bureau potatoes is from \$2.25 to \$2.35 per cwt.

Hunter Kills Valuable Horse
Last Thursday morning at about 5:30, some careless hunter shot and killed a valuable horse belonging to Mr. Cole, a hard working homesteader located next to the Sanders ranch two miles west of town. The horse was in Frank Smith's pasture where it apparently had been drinking at the tank along with some other horses at the time of being shot. The tank is near Mr. Smith's house and the horse was still warm when discovered. It had been shot three times, once in the forehead.

The hunter lacked the manhood to acknowledge the mistake and pay for the damage.
