MR. DAVID CRANAM ADEE,

Who arrived in Honolulu on Monday night by the City of Sydney, is commissioned by the State Department at Washington, to enquire into certain recent business matters between the Hawaiian Government, and the Pacific Mail S. S. Co. Mr. Adee will transact his business through His Excellency Rollin M. Daggett, U. S. Minister Resident. Mr. Adee is a lawyer of considerable repute in New York and Washington; he has been practising his profession for the last six years in the latter city. His brother is third Assistant-Secretary of State at Washington, and his father Dr. A. Adee was in Honolulu in 1834 or 1835 as fleet surgeon on board the U. S. S. Vincennes. Dr. Adee was so pleased with his visit to this Kingdom that he wrote a long account of the islands in his journal. Mr. Adee was formerly a journalist, and connected with the Washington *Weekly Republic*. He is accompanied by Mrs. Adee and proposes to remain in Honolulu for a month, staying at the Hawaiian Hotel. From a cursory glance at Honolulu, yesterday, Mr. Adee pronounced the city as thoroughly American. It is probable that Colonel Spreckels will arrive on the Mariposa, in connection with the above-mentioned business.

"BRASS."

"He that exalteth himself shall be abased." It is doubtful whether, in these days of progression, the above quotation holds good, but, from expressions let fall by many natives, their views seem to be in accordance with the ancient biblical citation. Their views, moreover, agree with those of well-informed individuals, who are more versed in court etiquette than a shepherd can be, not excepting The Shepherd.

The bone of contention, or, more strictly speaking, the impudence complained of, occurred at Fort Street Church last week. When His Majesty left the building, his chair, which, according to old Hawaiian customs, and modern court usages, should have remained vacant, was usurped by the Premier and Attorney-General *ad interim*. In apology for the presumption, it has been stated that the service had some effect upon the Premier, and caused him to muddle the law and the profits with the king and the commoner. The Attorney-General *ad interim* possibly thought that he was about to take his seat on the woolsack. Yet this palliation does not appease the natives, who are justly indignant at a man who openly places himself on an equality with their king. They say that "he that exalted himself shall be abased."

HAWAII'S PROTEST.

Referring to the above document, the *New Zealand Herald* says: "The theory of the Hawaiian Kingdom is, that it is, or should be, the leading State in the Pacific, and that a kind of 'Monroe doctrine' in its favor should be passed respecting all the islands. We surmised at the time that the 'move' was an American one, and that the acute Yankees who pull the strings in Honolulu were the parties really at work in this matter. This has been borne out by all our subsequent intelligence. We understand that Sir George Grey has received information that on July 30, a commissioner left Honolulu with a Hawaiian flag, which it was his intention to hoist in some of the islands. This gentleman was, of course, an American, and was dressed in an impressive uniform. There are about 25,000 Kanakas in Hawaii, quite incapable of exercising any powers of government or administration over islands situated at a distance from their own group, which itself is far distant from the mass of the Pacific Islands. The natives themselves really care nothing about the matter."
