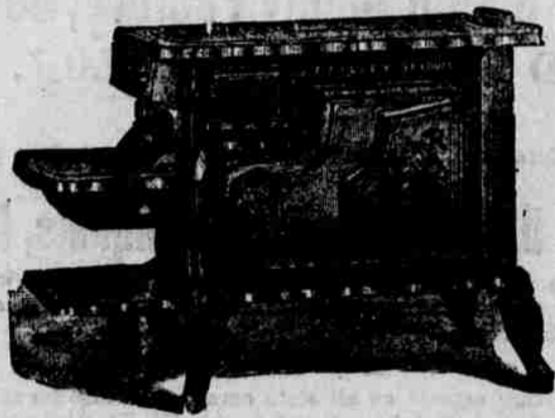

A QUICK TRIP.

TO HONOLULU AND BACK IN THIRTY-THREE DAYS.

The brig Consuelo, Captain E. B. Cousins, belonging to J. D. Spreckels & Bros., arrived in port yesterday afternoon from Honolulu, although the fact is not announced among the arrivals in the Call, Chronicle, Examiner and Commercial News of this morning. She left this port on April 16th, arriving at Honolulu on April 28th, making the run down in twelve days. She sailed from there again on May 3d, arriving off the Oceanic Company's dock here yesterday, May 19th. She has thus made the round trip in thirty-three days, including the time occupied in discharging and loading cargo while at Honolulu. The Consuelo is noted as being one of the fastest little vessels engaged in the Hawaiian trade, and Captain Cousins feels justly proud that she has made the quickest round trip on record from San Francisco to Honolulu and return, including detention at the islands. The schooner Anna, belonging to the same firm, has made the round trip to Kahului in the same time, but this is the quickest round trip that has been made to Honolulu.—[S. F. Daily Report.

PRESIDENTIAL BUZZING.

OVERWHELMING POPULARITY IN PENNSYLVANIA OF THE MAINE STATESMAN.

New York, May 17.—M. P. Handy, editor of the Philadelphia News, a personal friend of Blaine, perhaps knows as much about the future programme of the Maine statesman as any one in the Republican party. He says: "My State is unquestionably for Blaine. No other names are mentioned but that of Sherman and Allison. Blaine can have the delegation solid if he chooses. He is not anxious to be a candidate and is paying very little attention to all the talk about his running again in 1888. He will not accept the nomination unless it comes with practical unanimity. If he is nominated he will be elected. Senator Allison, after Blaine, would make a good run and carry the country. He represents the great Northwestern territory, which has never been prominent in the race for the Presidency. That territory is developing, and desires proper representation. Allison can carry New York as easily as any Eastern candidate, with the exception of Blaine. Sohn Sherman has considerable strength in Pennsylvania.
